

World's Story 2 Supplemental Resources...

Suggestions for middle school and lower high school (and as family read-alouds):

- *Son of Charlemagne* (8th century European history)
- *Flame Over Tara* (Ireland, during the days of St. Patrick, 4th-5th century Ireland)
- *A Single Shard* (12th century Korea)
- *The Hidden Treasure of Glaston* (12th century England, set in the time after the feud between Thomas Becket and King Henry)
- *Catherine Called Birdy* (13th century England)
- *The Samurai's Tale* (16th century Japan)
- *Master Cornhill* (mid 17th century, plague related)
- *The Shakespeare Stealer* (set during Elizabeth 1 reign - early 17th century England)

Historical Fiction and other books for High Schoolers:

- *Outlaws of Sherwood* (an interesting spin on the tale of Robin Hood)
- *The Best of Father Brown* (tales from a fun mystery-solving priest)
- *The Shining Company* (7th Century Britain)
- *Till We have Faces* (C.S. Lewis' master retelling of a myth - with a Christian worldview)
- *The Screwtape Letters* (not time-specific, but **HIGHLY** recommended for high schoolers)

Documentaries and other suggested resources for everyone:

- ***For the Church History section in the World's Story 2 Student Book, a great resource is *Christian History Made Easy* by Timothy Paul Jones.***
- ***Documentaries about Castles, knights, the Crusades, the Renaissance, the Reformation, and the advances in technology after the Renaissance, are all good topics.***
- ***For hands-on fun, allow younger students to build a castle out of cardboard boxes. There is a sample and directions in the back of the Student Book.***
- ***Also included in the appendix of the Student Book are other craft and cooking ideas, including a Medieval Feast.***
