Thumbprint Christmas Cookies



Ingredients

1 cup unsalted butter, softened

½ cup granulated sugar

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

2 cups all-purpose flour

¼ teaspoon salt

½ cup jam (strawberry, raspberry, or apricot)

Optional: powdered sugar for dusting

Instructions

Preheat oven to 350°F (175°C)

In a large bowl, cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy

Mix in vanilla

Gradually add flour and salt until dough forms

Roll dough into 1-inch balls and place on a lined baking sheet

Use your thumb (or spoon) to gently press an indentation in the center

Fill each indentation with ½ teaspoon jam

Bake for 12–14 minutes until edges are lightly golden

Cool on a wire rack

Optional: dust with powdered sugar

Cotton Ball Snowman

Materials

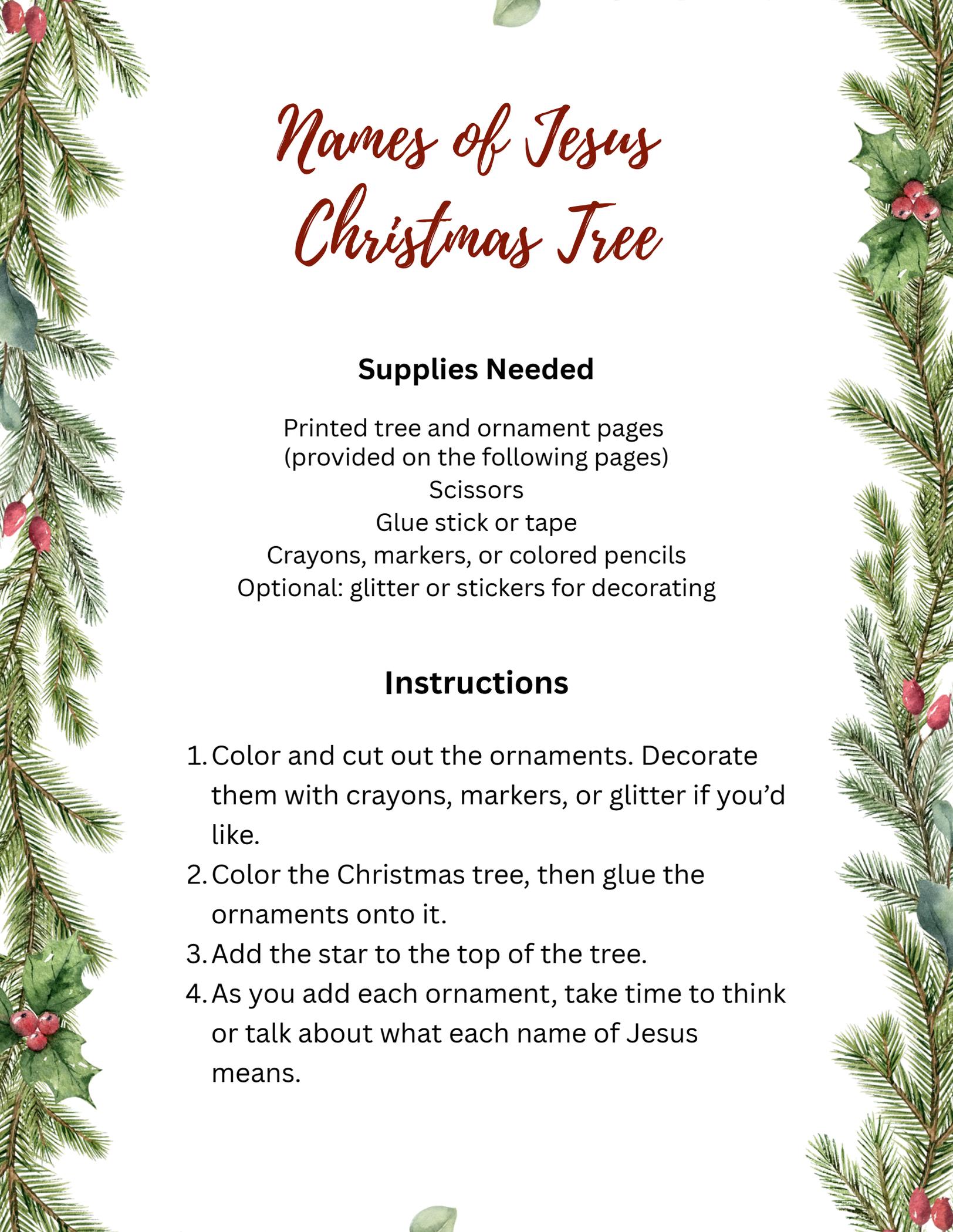
Cotton balls (8–12)
Construction paper
Glue
Markers/crayons
Scrap paper (hat, nose, scarf)
Optional: googly eyes, yarn, buttons

Instructions

Glue cotton balls into three circles (bottom, middle, head).
Add eyes, carrot nose, and smile.
Cut and glue a hat and scarf.
Decorate the background with snow or snowflakes.

Supplies Needed

Printed tree and ornament pages
(provided on the following pages)

Scissors

Glue stick or tape

Crayons, markers, or colored pencils

Optional: glitter or stickers for decorating

Instructions

1. Color and cut out the ornaments. Decorate them with crayons, markers, or glitter if you'd like.
2. Color the Christmas tree, then glue the ornaments onto it.
3. Add the star to the top of the tree.
4. As you add each ornament, take time to think or talk about what each name of Jesus means.
